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GEAR UP Iowa Video Challenge Winners Announced

Students from Perry and Columbus Junction win trip to youth conference in San Francisco

Des Moines, IA., February 19, 2013 – GEAR UP Iowa, a program administered by the Iowa College Student Aid Commission (Iowa College Aid) and funded through a federal Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs grant, announced today the three winning student videos from its first video challenge on the importance of postsecondary education. GEAR UP Iowa works to create a college-going culture through statewide and school-based services to a cohort of approximately 7,000 high school students and their families across the state. The ultimate goal is to increase the number of academically at-risk and economically disadvantaged students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. To help promote the importance of a college education and to increase educational attainment in Iowa, GEAR UP Iowa students were challenged with creating short videos covering a college-going topic of their choice. A total of 13 videos were submitted by teams of students from Columbus Junction High School, Davenport West High School, and Perry High School.

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The winning videos were selected based on the number of views each video received combined with evaluations from a panel of judges from GEAR UP Iowa and Iowa College Aid. The winning student team members will receive an all expenses paid trip to San Francisco, CA to attend the 2013 National Council for Community and Education Partnerships (NCCEP)/Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) conference and participate in the Youth Congress. At the Youth Congress, the students will have the opportunity to experience a professional conference, attend student-oriented training programs, and interact and learn with other students from around the country.

GEAR UP Iowa, administered by the Iowa College Student Aid Commission and funded by a \$16.8 million federal Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) grant, to increase the number of academically at-risk and economically disadvantaged students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education.
