Storm Lake High School Students Participate in ‘Heart of a Student’
Rap, hip-hop and social media elements get students excited about college

Des Moines, IA., April 16, 2013 – Storm Lake High School students will have the opportunity to experience a one-of-a-kind high school assembly that incorporates rap, hip-hop and social media elements to engage students and get them thinking about higher education. The event, which will be held at Storm Lake High School on Wednesday, April 17, 2013 at 2:00 p.m., is made possible through GEAR UP Iowa, a federally-funded grant program administered by the Iowa College Student Aid Commission (Iowa College Aid).

Heart of a Student was founded by Dante Means, a former admissions counselor for Iowa State University and University of Northern Iowa. The program engages students through music and social media to get them to look beyond high school and encourages them to invest their energy into positive activities that support their future aspirations. Unique in its approach, Heart of a Student provides a fun, energetic and exciting atmosphere while incorporating educational and college planning content.

“The mission of GEAR UP Iowa is to significantly increase the number of students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education,” explained John Gilman, GEAR UP Iowa Project Coordinator for Iowa College Aid. “We are excited to partner with Heart of a Student and to bring this experience to the students at Storm Lake High School,” stated Gilman. “Heart of a Student aligns with GEAR UP Iowa’s mission and promotes the importance of higher education in a format that is highly engaging and relatable to high school students.”

The GEAR UP Iowa program began serving a cohort of seventh grade students during the 2008-2009 academic year at partner schools in 18 Iowa communities with greater than 50 percent of their student population participating in the federal Free and Reduced Price Lunch Program. The approximately 7,000 GEAR UP Iowa students, now high school juniors, many of whom are from economically disadvantaged and/or academically at-risk backgrounds, are in more than 150 high schools across the state. GEAR UP Iowa has worked with partner schools over the past five years to help prepare students for success in postsecondary education.

The majority of GEAR UP Iowa cohort students attend high school in one of the following communities: Cedar Rapids, Clinton, Columbus Junction, Council Bluffs, Davenport, Denison, Des Moines, Diagonal, Jefferson, Keokuk, Marshalltown, Ottumwa, Perry, Sioux City, Storm Lake, Walnut and Waterloo.
