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Iowa College Aid Sponsors Leadership Camp to Help Students Overcome Barriers to Academic and Personal Success

More than 100 GEAR UP Iowa students will participate in the Quantum Learning for Students program

Des Moines, IA, August 1, 2013 –Over 100 GEAR UP Iowa students from across the state have chosen to attend a summer camp that will assist them in gaining leadership skills, acquiring academic habits and learning strategies for educational and personal success. They arrived on the Iowa State University campus on Sunday, July 28, 2013, to participate in a unique week-long camp which combines academics with life skill sessions.

The camp, Quantum Learning for Students, is based on more than 30 years experience and research with more than 8 million students and 55,000 educators across the United States. The program assists students in building a strong foundation for their future scholastic work, along with providing a chance to connect with other students from every corner of the state while learning from dynamic educators. This is the third year that the Iowa College Student Aid Commission (Iowa College Aid) has made the leadership camp possible by using funds from a federal GEAR UP Grant.

“The mission of GEAR UP Iowa is to significantly increase the number of students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education,” explained John Gilman, GEAR UP Iowa Project Coordinator for Iowa College Aid. “Many of our GEAR UP Iowa students are from economically disadvantaged and academically at-risk backgrounds,” said Gilman. “Throughout the week, sessions will consist of approximately a 50 / 50 mix of academic and life skills content. Students will build confidence and add to their toolbox of academic skills while taking a giant leap forward on their pathway to success in educational endeavors beyond high school.”

Partnering with Iowa State University provides an added benefit for students. “The GEAR UP Iowa students will be high school seniors this fall, some are even graduating early, so now is the time for them to research and apply to colleges,” stated Karen Misjak, executive director of Iowa College Aid, the state

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agency charged with administering the statewide GEAR UP Iowa grant. “While staying at the Iowa State University campus, students will have a chance to experience aspects of college life first-hand which will aid in the college selection process.”

Training sessions similar to this year’s GEAR UP Iowa Quantum Learning for Students summer camp on the Iowa State University campus often cost as much as thousands of dollars per student to attend. Thanks to funding from Iowa’s federal GEAR UP grant and partnerships with Quantum Learning and Iowa State University, GEAR UP Iowa cohort students are attending the camp at no cost.

In addition to the student camp, a professional development track is also being held the same week for educators teaching in GEAR UP Iowa schools across the state. Traditional approaches, mixed with new research on learning, aim to boost the ability of educators to inspire students to achieve. Quantum Learning shows educators how to orchestrate student success by taking into account everything in the classroom, including the environment, the design of the curriculum and how it’s presented.
