Iowa College Aid Recognizes National Merit[®] Scholarship Program Semifinalists

Two students from Fort Dodge, Iowa were honored

Des Moines, IA., September 23, 2013 – The Iowa College Student Aid Commission (Iowa College Aid) announced today that 176 Iowa high school seniors were among the nearly 16,000 national semifinalists recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). Among these semifinalists, are Cayla M. Foltz and Timothy S. Hatton from Fort Dodge, Iowa. These high school seniors have earned the opportunity to continue in the competition to become National Merit Scholarship[®] Finalists and recipients of some 8,000 National Merit Scholarships, worth a total of \$35 million.

In order to qualify as a National Merit[®] Scholarship Semifinalist, students must take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT[®]) as a high school junior. The highest-scoring entrants in each state are chosen in proportion to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors. In total, the Semifinalists are less than one percent of all U.S. high school seniors. Around 1.5 million juniors in over 22,000 high schools competed to become 2014 National Merit[®] Scholarship Program Semifinalists.

The next step for these Semifinalists will be to submit a scholarship application that includes information regarding their academic record, extracurricular and community activities, leadership abilities, employment, honors and awards. Semifinalists must have an exemplary academic record, receive an endorsement by a high school official, submit an essay and receive exceptionally high SAT scores. The 2014 National Merit Scholarship winners will be announced in four separate press releases starting in April and ending in July.

“We are extremely proud to have so many bright and talented Iowa high school seniors,” said Karen Misjak, executive director of Iowa College Aid. “We’d like to congratulate these seniors on their incredible accomplishments and wish them the best of luck in their pursuit to become Finalists. We hope they will take advantage of the free test prep our agency offers through I Have A Plan Iowa[®] so they can do their absolute best on the SAT.”

By utilizing the I Have A Plan Iowa[®] Test Prep, students can make a personalized study plan based on the approaching test date and their current skill level. The SAT[®] portion of the test prep focuses on sharpening students' math and verbal skills. Students receive immediate feedback on incorrect answers and are given suggestions on what to study next. Students can also designate a test prep coach, such as a parent or teacher, who will receive updates on the student's progress so that they can provide further support and advice.
