

CHAPTER 6

IOWA VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL TUITION GRANT PROGRAM

Overview

The Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant Program provides need-based financial assistance to Iowa residents enrolled in career and technical education (CTE) programs at Iowa community colleges. Grants for full-time students range from \$400 to \$1,200, depending on financial need and available funds, and are used to cover tuition and fee charges.

A. ELIGIBILITY

1. College

To be eligible to participate in the Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant Program, colleges must be Iowa-supported community colleges. Students attending the following colleges are eligible to receive Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant awards:

2. Student

In addition to the general eligibility requirements found in Chapter 1, eligible Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant recipients must be admitted and in attendance in CTE education courses of at least 15 weeks in length.

B. APPLICATION PROCESS

Students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as described in Chapter 1.

C. SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Eligible students must be enrolled and in attendance in courses of study defined by the Iowa Department of Education as CTE education programs. Students who are required to complete arts and science courses as a part of their CTE education programs may have these courses included as eligible program courses.

Students who have not yet begun taking core CTE education courses are not eligible to receive Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grants, as these students are not currently enrolled and in attendance in CTE education programs (guidance established 5/2008).

Students who are enrolled in core CTE education courses, and have begun taking those courses, sometimes are enrolled in subsequent semesters during which no official core CTE education courses are being attended. These students are making progress toward completion of their CTE education programs and will be allowed to receive Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grants (guidance established 5/2008).

Students with Bachelors' degrees may receive Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grants if they enroll in CTE education programs at Iowa community colleges.

Grants are awarded to eligible students by college officials. Recipients must be on-time applicants (those meeting the Commission's July 1 priority deadline) whose EFC levels are within the parameters defined by the Commission.

The Application Receipt Date on the student's Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) MUST indicate that the student met the priority filing deadline.

D. AWARD AMOUNTS AND LIMITS

The maximum Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant award is \$1,200 for eligible Iowa students who enroll on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 hours per semester or the quarter equivalent).

Eligible full-time students may receive the following award amounts:

Eligible students who do not receive the maximum award during the 9-month academic year may receive additional funding for summer (up to the maximum annual award) if summer awards are authorized (according to the awarding schedule above). However, no summer payment may exceed the amount the student would have received for a term during the 9-month academic year.

Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant awards are tuition/fee-restricted in nature. When awarded in combination with other tuition/fee-restricted funds, total tuition/fee-restricted funding that includes an Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant cannot exceed total tuition and mandatory fees charged to the recipient. In most cases, the Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant award is reduced to comply with this policy. For recipients of Chapter 33 veterans education tuition payments, the Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant award should be applied to tuition and mandatory fees prior to the calculation of the Chapter 33 tuition/fee award (guidance established 6/23/11).

Part-time recipients receive awards based on a prorated portion of the full-time award. The proration is established by the Commission and is consistent with federal Pell Grant Program proration.

In no circumstance may a student receive more than the sum of the annual maximums allowed by law for two consecutive academic years. Full-time students may receive awards during a maximum two-year period of time (8 quarters or 4 semesters plus two summer terms). However, part-time students may attend longer than two years to receive the full benefit.

E. AWARD NOTIFICATIONS

College officials should provide award notices to all Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant recipients. Award notices must clearly indicate award amounts and the state programs from which students will benefit. All notices concerning state grants must include the following award notification statement:

“In the event that available state funds are insufficient to pay the full amount of each approved grant, the Iowa College Student Aid Commission has the authority to administratively reduce the award.”

The Commission understands that college officials begin notifying students of award amounts prior to the end of each year's Legislative Session. In order to minimize confusion and limit the workload at colleges and simultaneously be consistent with current legislation regarding award maximums, award notices must include awards at the current statutory maximum.

F. RENEWAL ELIGIBILITY

Applicants may apply for a second year, and in some cases a third year, of Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant awards. Students enrolled in CTE education programs and making satisfactory progress toward completion of the program but who are required by the college to take additional courses, including liberal arts classes, to complete the program, may continue to receive awards for up to one additional year of study if they are not able to complete the programs during the normal two-year time frame allowed for students to receive a grant.

If students have received the maximum grant for two years, the students may regain eligibility after a two-year absence from the community college upon reentering a new program major (CTE education).

G. CHANGES/CORRECTIONS

Any changes in awards must be provided to Commission staff electronically via the State Scholarship and Grant Reporting System (see Chapter 3 and Appendix A).

H. VERIFICATION/COMPLIANCE

College officials are responsible for completing required federal verification procedures and for coordinating all aid to ensure compliance with student eligibility and allowable award amounts.

For students selected for federal verification, one disbursement of state-funded student financial aid may be made prior to completing the verification process as long as college or university officials have no reason to believe application information is inaccurate. If students become ineligible for aid due to verification activities, refunds must be made to state-funded programs.
