

maximum punishments and fines. A similar state law carries sanctions of up to five years of imprisonment and up to \$100,000 fine for similar violations.

#### SCHOOL SANCTIONS \*\*

(APPLIED TO ALL CATEGORIES OF SUBSTANCES)

##### Students

Possession, use, sale of any amount on school property or as part of any school activity. Sanctions for this violation could lead up to expulsion.

##### Student Disciplinary Sanctions Defined

Disciplinary Probation - A specified period of time during which the student's activities may be curtailed, for which an active student is advised in writing of probable suspension or expulsion for future misconduct.

Suspension - Temporary exclusion from any extra-curricular activities for a specified period of time with the student advised in writing of probable expulsion for future misconduct. Conditions for terminating the suspension period and appeal will be stated in the written order of suspension.

Expulsion - Termination of student status for an indefinite period; usually a permanent dismissal from the School. Conditions of expulsion and appeal will be stated in the written order of expulsion.

##### Faculty and Staff

While performing school business under the influence, possession, use, sale, furnishing to a minor. Sanctions for this violation could lead up to recommendations for dismissal.

\*\* These sanctions are in addition to any criminal sanctions that may be imposed. Student employees are subject to both employee and student sanctions.

## **STUDENT RIGHTS UNDER FERPA**

*(The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act)*

DeVry Inc. and its subsidiaries (American University of the Caribbean, Carrington College, Carrington College California, Chamberlain College of Nursing, DeVry University, Ross University School of Medicine, and Ross University School of Veterinary Medicine) respect the rights and privacy of its students and acknowledge the responsibility to maintain confidentiality of personally identifiable information.

FERPA is a federal law that affords students the following rights with respect to their education records:

1. **THE RIGHT TO INSPECT AND REVIEW THE STUDENT'S EDUCATION RECORDS**

Students have the right to review their education records within 45 days of the day the institution receives their request. Students should submit to the registrar, dean, or head of the academic department written requests that identify the record(s) they wish to inspect. The institution official will make arrangements for access and notify the student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the official to whom the request is submitted does not maintain the records, that official will advise the student of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

2. **THE RIGHT TO SEEK AN AMENDMENT OF INACCURATE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION**

Students may ask the institution to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write to the official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record they believe should be changed and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the institution decides not to amend the record as requested by the student, the student will be notified of the decision and advised of his or her right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the student when they are notified of the right to a hearing. Following the hearing, if the institution still decides not to amend the record, the student has a right to place a clarifying statement in the record. The institution is not required to consider requests for amendment to grades or disciplinary decisions.

3. **THE RIGHT TO LIMIT DISCLOSURE OF PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION**

Students have the right to consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in their educational records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. An exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials who have legitimate educational interests, and the disclosure of directory information. Directory information is not considered to be harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. See additional information on next page.

### CAMPUS SEX CRIMES PREVENTION ACT

The Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act requires sex offenders already required to register in a State to provide notice, as required under State law, to each institution of higher education in that state at which the person is employed, carries on a vocation, or is a student. The act requires that state procedures ensure this registration information is promptly made available to law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction where the institutions of higher education are located and that it is entered into appropriate state records or data systems. These changes became effective two years after enactment of the law (2002).

This act amends the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require institutions of higher education to issue a statement, in addition to other disclosures required under that Act, advising the campus community where law enforcement agency information provided by a State concerning registered sex offenders may be obtained. This change takes effect two years after enactment (2002).

This act amends the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 to clarify that nothing in that Act may be construed to prohibit an educational institution from disclosing information provided to the institution concerning registered sex offenders; requires the Secretary of Education to take appropriate steps to notify educational institutions that disclosure of this information is permitted.

Convicted sex offenders or sexual predators attending or employed at an institution of higher education in Illinois are required to comply with The Illinois Sex Offender Registration Act. The act requires sex offenders/predators to register in person with the public safety or security director of the institution of higher education at which he or she is employed or attends. [Adopt] a policy to offer not less than the following options to a student who is a member, or the spouse of a member if the member has a dependent child, of the Iowa national guard or reserve forces of the United States and who is ordered to state military service or federal service or duty:
  - i. Withdraw from the student's entire registration and receive a full refund of tuition and mandatory fees.
  - ii. Make arrangements with the student's instructors for course grades, or for incompletes that shall be completed by the student at a later date. If such arrangements are made, the student's registration shall remain intact and tuition and mandatory fees shall be assessed for the courses in full.
  - iii. Make arrangements with only some of the student's instructors for grades, or for incompletes that shall be completed by the student at a later

date. If such arrangements are made, the registration for those courses shall remain intact and tuition and mandatory fees shall be assessed for those courses. Any course for which arrangements cannot be made for grades or incompletes shall be considered dropped and the tuition and mandatory fees for the course refunded.

Iowa Student Refund Policy

Iowa students who withdraw prior to completing an 8 week session receive a pro rata refund of no less than ninety percent of the tuition charged for the session based upon the ratio of the number of remaining or incomplete calendar days in the session to the total number of calendar days in the session.

Iowa national guard or reserve forces of the United States, their spouse or dependent child are offered the following options should the service member be ordered to state military service or federal service or duty:

1. Withdraw from the student's entire registration and receive a full refund of tuition and mandatory fees.
2. Arrangement will be made with the student's instructors for course grades, or for incompletes that shall be completed by the student at a later date. If such arrangements are made, the student's registration shall remain intact and tuition and mandatory fees shall be assessed for the courses in full.
3. Arrangement will be made with only some of the student's instructors for grades, or for incompletes that shall be completed by the student at a later date. If such arrangements are made, the registration for those courses shall remain intact and tuition and mandatory fees shall be assessed for those courses. Any course for which arrangements cannot be made for grades or incompletes shall be considered dropped and the tuition and mandatory fees for the course refunded.



3. Purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized:

The purpose of the corporation is:

To establish degree-granting educational institutions in which individuals may be taught such branches of useful, practical and/or general knowledge as shall prepare them for a career, a profession, or occupations requiring knowledge in the arts and sciences, as well as further study and educational activities.

To impart instruction, conduct examinations, and confer academic degrees in branches of engineering, technology, business operations, telecommunications, information systems, and other branches of human knowledge. To prepare, manufacture, sell and generally deal in books, lesson and examination papers, drawings, instruments, tools and school supplies of every class and description; and

To engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the Business Corporation Act of the State of Illinois.

## EXHIBIT B

TO

### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The total number of shares which the Corporation shall have authority to issue is two million and forty two thousand and nine hundred and eighteen (2,042,918), consisting of one million two hundred and sixty thousand and two hundred and twelve (1,260,212) shares of Common Stock, par value \$.01 per share (the "Common Stock"), and seven hundred and eighty two thousand and seven hundred and six (782,706) shares of Preferred Stock, par value \$.01 per share (the "Preferred Stock"). The Board of Directors may classify and reclassify any unissued shares of Preferred Stock by setting or changing in any one or more respects the preferences, conversion or other rights, voting powers, restrictions, limitations as to dividends, qualifications or terms or conditions of redemption of such shares of Preferred Stock.

#### SECTION I.

##### Preferred Stock

A. The power of the Board of Directors to classify and reclassify any of the shares of Preferred Stock shall include, without limitation, subject to the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation, authority to classify or reclassify any unissued shares of Preferred Stock into a class or classes of Preferred Stock, and to divide and classify shares of any class into one or more series of such class by determining, fixing, or altering one or more of the following:

(1) Designation. The distinctive designation of such class or series and the number of shares to constitute such class or series; provided that, unless otherwise prohibited by the terms of such other or any class or series, the number of shares of any such class or series may be decreased by the Board of Directors in connection with any classification or reclassification of unissued shares and the number of shares of such class or series may be increased by the Board of Directors in connection with any such classification or reclassification, and any shares of any class or series which have been redeemed, purchased, otherwise acquired or converted into shares of Common Stock or any other class or series shall become part of the authorized capital stock and be subject to classification and reclassification as provided in this Section.

(2) Dividends. Whether or not and, if so, the rates, amounts and time at which, the conditions under which, dividends shall be payable on shares of such class or series, whether any such dividends shall rank senior or junior to or on a parity with the dividends payable on any other class or series of stock, the status of any such dividends as cumulative, cumulative to a limited extent or non-cumulative and as participating or non-participating.

(3) Voting. Whether or not shares of such class or series shall have voting rights, in addition to any voting rights provided by law and, if so, the terms of such voting rights.

(4) Conversion. Whether or not shares of such class or series shall have conversion or exchange privileges and, if so, the terms and conditions thereof, including provision for adjustment of the conversion or exchange rate upon such events or at such times as the Board of Directors shall determine.

(5) Redemption. Whether or not shares of such class or series shall be subject to redemption and, if so, the terms and conditions of such redemption, including the date or dates upon or after which they shall be redeemable and the amount per share payable in case of redemption, which amount may vary under different conditions and at different redemption dates; and whether or not there shall be any sinking fund or purchase account in respect thereof, and if so, the terms thereof.

(6) Litigation. The rights of the holders of shares of such class or series upon the liquidation, dissolution or winding up of the affairs of, or upon any distribution of the assets of the Corporation, which rights may vary depending upon whether such liquidation, dissolution or winding up is voluntary or involuntary and, if voluntary, may vary at different dates, and whether such rights shall rank senior or junior to or on a parity with such rights of any other class or series of stock.

(7) Restrictions. Whether or not there shall be any limitations applicable, while shares of such class or series are outstanding, upon the payment of dividends or making of distributions on, or the acquisition of, or the use of monies for purchase or redemption of, any stock of the Corporation, or upon any other action of the Corporation including action under this Section, and, if so, the terms and conditions thereof.

(8) Miscellaneous. Any other preferences, rights, restrictions, including restrictions on transferability, and qualifications of shares of such class or series, not inconsistent with law and the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation.

(9) Ranking. For the purposes hereof and of any articles of designation providing for the classification or reclassification of any unissued shares of Preferred Stock or of any other charter document of the Corporation (unless otherwise provided in any such articles of designation), any class or series of stock of the Corporation shall be deemed to rank:

(i) prior to another class or series either as to dividends or upon liquidation, if the holders of such class or series shall be entitled to the receipt of dividends or of amounts distributable on liquidation, dissolution or winding up, as the case may be, in preference or priority to holders of such other class or series;

(ii) on a parity with another class or series either as to dividends or upon liquidation, whether or not the dividend rates, dividend payment dates or redemption or liquidation price per share thereof be different from those of such others, if the holders of such class or series of stock shall be entitled to receipt of dividends or amounts

distributable upon liquidation, dissolution or winding up, as the case may be, in proportion to their respective dividend rates or redemption or liquidation prices, without preference or priority over the holders of such other class or series; and

(iii) junior to another class or series either as to dividends or upon liquidation, if the rights of the holders of such class or series shall be subject or subordinate to the rights of the holders of such other class or series in respect of the receipt of dividends or the amounts distributable upon liquidation, dissolution or winding up, as the case may be.

## SECTION II.

### Common Stock

B. A statement of the designations, powers, preferences, rights, qualifications, limitations and restrictions in respect of the shares of Common Stock is as follows:

(1) Dividends. The Board of Directors of the Corporation may cause dividends to be paid to the holders of shares of Common Stock out of funds legally available for the payment of dividends by declaring an amount per share as a dividend. When and as dividends are declared, other than dividends declared with respect to the Preferred Stock, whether payable in cash, in property or in shares of stock of the Corporation, the holders of Common Stock shall be entitled to share equally, share for share, in such dividends. No dividends shall be declared or paid in shares of Common Stock, or options, warrants, or rights to acquire such stock or securities convertible into or exchangeable for shares of such stock, except dividends payable ratably according to the number of shares of Common Stock held by them, in shares of, or securities convertible into or exchangeable for, Common Stock to holders of that class of stock.

(2) Liquidations Rights. In the event of any voluntary or involuntary liquidation, dissolution or winding up of the affairs of the Corporation, after payment shall have been made to the holders of Preferred Stock of the full amount to which they shall be entitled, the holders of Common Stock shall be entitled, to the exclusion of the holders of Preferred Stock, to share ratably according to the number of shares of Common Stock held by them, in all remaining assets of the Corporation available for distribution to its stockholders.

(3) Voting Rights. Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporation or by applicable law, the holders of Common Stock shall be entitled to vote on each matter on which the shareholders of the Corporation shall be entitled to vote, and each holder of Common Stock shall be entitled to one vote for each share of such stock held by him.

FIFTH: At all meetings of shareholders, each shareholder shall be entitled to vote, in person or by proxy, the shares of voting stock owned by such shareholders of record on the record date for the meeting. When a quorum is present or represented at any meeting, the vote of the holders of a majority of the voting power of all of the shares of stock of the Corporation outstanding and entitled to vote on any matter, question or

proposal brought before such meeting shall decide such question, unless the question is one upon which, by express provision of law, this Certificate of Incorporation or the Bylaws, a different vote is required, in which case such express provision shall govern and control the decision of such questions.

EXHIBIT C

TO

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

**SEVENTH:** The number of directors of the Corporation shall be fixed from time to time by the vote of a majority of the entire Board of Directors, but such number shall in no case be less than three nor more than 12. Any such determination made by the Board of Directors shall continue in effect unless and until changed by the Board of Directors, but no such changes shall affect the term of any directors then in office.

The directors shall be divided into three classes, designated Class I, Class II and Class III. Each class shall consist, as nearly as may be possible, of one-third of the total number of directors constituting the entire Board of Directors. At the 2002 annual meeting of stockholders, Class I directors shall be elected for a one-year term, Class II directors for a two-year term and Class III directors for a three-year term. At each succeeding annual meeting of stockholders beginning in 2003, successors to the class of directors whose term expires at the annual meeting shall be elected for a three-year term. If the authorized number of directors is changed, any increase or decrease shall be apportioned among the classes so as to maintain the number of directors in each class as nearly equal as possible, and any additional director of any class elected to fill a vacancy resulting from any increase in such class shall hold office for a term that shall coincide with the remaining term of that class, but in no case will a decrease in the number of directors shorten the term of any incumbent director. A director shall hold office until the annual meeting for the year in which his or her term expires and until his or her successor shall be elected and shall qualify, subject, however, to prior death, resignation, retirement, disqualification or removal from office. Subject to the By-Laws, a majority of the entire Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Any vacancy on the Board of Directors that results from an increase in the number of directors shall be filled only by a majority of the Board of Directors then in office, provided that a quorum is present, and any other vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors shall be filled by a majority of the directors then in office, even if less than a quorum or by a sole remaining director. Any director elected to fill a vacancy not resulting from an increase in the number of directors shall have the same remaining term as that of his or her predecessor.

Any director elected by the stockholders, or by the Board of Directors to fill a vacancy, may be removed only for cause by the affirmative vote of the holders of a majority of the votes which could be cast by the holders of all the outstanding shares of capital stock entitled to vote for the election of directors, voting together as a class, given at a duly called annual or special meeting of shareholders.

Advance notice of nominations for the election of directors, other than nominations by the Board of Directors or a committee thereof, shall be given to the Corporation in the manner provided in the By-Laws.

**EIGHTH:** Whenever a compromise or arrangement is proposed between this Corporation and its creditors or any class of them and/or between this Corporation and its shareholders or any class of them, any court of equitable jurisdiction within the State of Illinois may, on the application in a summary way of this Corporation or of any creditor or shareholder thereof or on the application of any receiver or receivers appointed for this Corporation under the provisions of the Illinois Business Corporation Act (the "**BCA**") or on the application of trustees in dissolution or of any receiver or receivers appointed for this Corporation under the provisions of the BCA order a meeting of the creditors or class of creditors, and/or of the shareholders or class of shareholders of this Corporation, as the case may be, to be summoned in such manner as the said court directs. If a majority in number representing three-fourths in value of the creditors or class of creditors, and/or of the shareholders or class of shareholders of this Corporation, as the case may be, agree to any compromise or arrangement and to any reorganization of the Corporation as a consequence of such compromise or arrangement, the said compromise or arrangement and the said reorganization shall, if sanctioned by the court to which the said application has been made, be binding on all the shareholders or class of shareholders of this Corporation, as the case may be, and also on this Corporation.

**NINTH:** For the management of the business and for the conduct of the affairs of the Corporation, and in further definition, limitation and regulation of the powers of the Corporation and of its directors and of its shareholders or any class thereof, as the case may be, it is further provided:

(1) The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by or under the direction of the Board of Directors.

(2) Subject to the terms and conditions of any articles of designation in respect of any class or series of Preferred Stock, the directors shall have concurrent power with the shareholders to make, alter, amend, change, add to or repeal the By-Laws of the Corporation.

(3) In addition to the powers and authority hereinbefore or by statute expressly conferred upon them, the directors are hereby empowered to exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Corporation, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the BCA, the Articles of Incorporation, and any By-Laws hereafter adopted by the shareholders shall invalidate any prior act of the directors which would have been valid if such By-Law had not been adopted.

**TENTH:** (1) Meetings of shareholders may be held within or without the State of Illinois, as the By-Laws may provide. The books of the Corporation may be kept (subject to any provision contained in the BCA outside the State of Illinois at such place or places as may be designated from time to time by the Board of Directors or in the By-Laws of the Corporation.

(2) Any action required or permitted to be taken by the shareholders of the Corporation must be effected at a duly called annual or special meeting of such holders and may not be effected by a consent in writing by any such holders.

(3) Except as otherwise required by law, special meetings of the shareholders of the Corporation may be called only by (i) the Board of Directors pursuant to a resolution approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office, (ii) the Chairman of the Board, if one is elected or (iii) the President. Only those matters set forth in the notice of the special meeting may be considered or acted upon at such special meeting, unless otherwise provided by law.

**ELEVENTH:** (1) The Corporation shall, to the fullest extent permitted by the BCA, as the same may be amended and supplemented, indemnify any and all directors and officers, and may upon the act of the Board of Directors, indemnify all other persons whom it shall have the power to indemnify under said Section, from and against any and all of the expenses, liabilities or other matters referred to in or covered by said Section, and the indemnification provided for herein shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those indemnified may be entitled under any By-Law, agreement, vote of shareholders or disinterested directors or otherwise, both as to action in his official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as a director or officer who has ceased to be a director or officer and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of the director or officer, and may, upon such act of the Board of Directors, continue as to such other persons and inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such other persons.

(2) No director shall be personally liable to the Corporation or any of its shareholders for monetary damages for any breach of fiduciary duty as a director, except for liability (i) for breach of the director's duty of loyalty to the Corporation or its shareholders, (ii) for acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law, (iii) pursuant to Section 865 of the BCA or (iv) for any transaction from which the director derived an improper personal benefit. Any repeal or modification of this ARTICLE ELEVENTH by the shareholders of the Corporation shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification with respect to acts or omissions occurring prior to such repeal or modification.

**TWELFTH:** From time to time any of the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation may be amended, altered or repealed, and other provisions authorized by the laws of the State of Illinois at the time in force may be added or inserted in the manner and at the time prescribed by said laws, and all rights at any time conferred upon the shareholders of the Corporation by these Articles of Incorporation are granted subject to the provisions of the ARTICLE TWELFTH.

**THIRTEENTH:** The Corporation reserves the right to repeal, alter or amend these Articles of Incorporation in the manner now or hereinafter prescribed by statute. No repeal, alteration or amendment of these Articles of Incorporation shall be made unless the same is first approved by the Board of Directors of the Corporation pursuant to a resolution adopted by the directors then in office in accordance with the By-Laws and applicable law and thereafter approved by the shareholders.

### DeVry Inc. Announces Third-Quarter 2013 Results

DOWNERS GROVE, Ill.--(BUSINESS WIRE)-- DeVry Inc. (NYSE: DV), a global provider of educational services, today reported academic, operational and financial results for its fiscal 2013 third-quarter ended March 31, 2013. DeVry also reported enrollment results at DeVry Brasil, Chamberlain College of Nursing, Carrington Colleges Group, and DeVry University and its Keller Graduate School of Management.

#### Academic and operational results this quarter included:

- DeVry University received reaccreditation from the Higher Learning Commission through 2019
- DeVry University new undergraduate student enrollment down 21 percent
- 17.5 percent increase in new enrollments at Carrington
- 17 percent total student growth at Chamberlain College of Nursing
- Chamberlain opened a new campus in Cleveland, bringing the total number of campuses to 12
- Becker Professional Education prepared 37 of 39 of Elijah Watts Sells winners for the 2012 CPA Exam
- 60 percent revenue growth at DeVry Brasil in the quarter, including acquisitions

#### Selected financial data for the three months ended March 31, 2013:

- Revenues decreased 5.9 percent to \$509 million
- Reported net income decreased 15.4 percent to \$57 million, and net income excluding discrete items was \$58 million, down 13.5 percent
- Reported diluted earnings per share decreased 12 percent to \$0.88, and earnings per share excluding discrete items was \$0.90, down 10.0 percent

#### Selected financial data for the nine months ended March 31, 2013:

- Revenues decreased 5.5 percent to \$1,497 million
- Reported net income increased 4.2 percent to \$139 million, and net income excluding discrete items was \$146 million, down 21.8 percent
- Reported diluted earnings per share increased 9.7 percent to \$2.15, and earnings per share excluding discrete items was \$2.26, down 17.5 percent
- Operating cash flow was \$282 million, compared to \$355 million last year
- Repurchased approximately 2 million shares of common stock at an average price of \$23.97

"While most of our institutions are performing well, we were disappointed with new student enrollment at DeVry University," said Daniel Hamburger, DeVry's president and chief executive officer. "We are focused on better communicating the return on educational investment of DeVry University degrees to potential students. In addition, we are aggressively managing our costs and now expect to achieve \$100 million in cost savings this fiscal year."

Reported results for both the current and prior year periods include discrete items. The results for the three and nine months ended March 31, 2013, include after-tax restructuring charges of \$1.3 million and \$7.2 million, respectively, related to severance and real estate consolidation. The results for the nine months ended March 31, 2012, include impairment charges of \$55.8 million after-tax, and a \$2.2 million gain, net of tax (see "Use of Non-GAAP Financial Information and Supplemental Reconciliation Schedule").

#### Organizational Highlights

##### Business, Technology and Management Segment

###### DeVry University

For the March 2013 session at DeVry University new undergraduate enrollments decreased 21.2 percent to 5,146 versus 6,533 the previous year. Total undergraduate students decreased 16.5 percent to 47,537 versus 56,958 for the session a year ago.

At the graduate level, including Keller Graduate School of Management, total coursetakers in the March session decreased 18.4 percent to 19,075 versus 23,366 for the same session a year ago.

The total number of online undergraduate and graduate coursetakers in the March session decreased 10.6 percent to 60,834 versus 68,083 in the same session a year ago.

Enrollment results continue to be impacted by lower cyclical demand among the university's target segment of students. The plan to improve enrollment results includes enhancing communications to students about DeVry University's excellent graduate employment results; addressing affordability through scholarships and pricing; and enhancing partnerships with corporate and government organizations.

During the quarter, DeVry University received reaccreditation from the Higher Learning Commission through 2019.

##### Medical and Healthcare Segment

###### DeVry Medical International

In the third quarter, American University of the Caribbean School of Medicine appointed Heidi Chumley, M.D. as executive dean and chief academic officer. Chumley most recently served as associate vice chancellor for educational resources and interprofessional education at the University of Kansas School of Medicine.

Ross University School of Medicine recently announced a new affiliation agreement with Atlanta Medical Center that will enable students to complete required clinical rotations in family practice, internal medicine, pediatrics, psychiatry, obstetrics and gynecology and surgery.

Enrollment for the May semester at DeVry Medical International will be reported with the fourth-quarter and year-end results on August 8, 2013.

#### Chamberlain College of Nursing

Chamberlain's new online student enrollment in the March session increased 15.9 percent to 1,344 compared to 1,160 in March 2012. New enrollments in the March session were impacted by a realignment of Chamberlain's academic calendar, which resulted in no new campus-based students in the session. Total student enrollment increased 16.9 percent to 13,235 compared to 11,321 during the same period last year.

During the quarter, Chamberlain announced the launch of the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program, which will be offered in May. In addition, Chamberlain received approvals from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for a Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program, which is expected to begin in the fall of 2013, pending accreditor approval.

Chamberlain also opened a new Cleveland location in January, and will open the new Tinley Park, Ill., location in May.

#### Carrington Colleges Group

Carrington continues to make progress on its turnaround plan. For the three month period ending March 31, 2013, new student enrollment for Carrington Colleges Group increased 17.5 percent to 2,391 versus 2,035 in the previous year, marking its third consecutive quarter with double-digit new student enrollment growth. Total enrollment increased 8.8 percent to 7,951 compared to 7,309 in the prior year.

#### International, K-12, and Professional Education Segment

##### Becker Professional Education

Becker recently announced that 37 of 39 of the Elijah Watts Sells winners for the 2012 CPA Exam prepared using the Becker CPA Exam Review. During the quarter, Becker opened new locations in New York and Chicago for the U.S. Medical Licensing Exam preparation course.

##### DeVry Brasil

DeVry Brasil's new student enrollment in the March session increased 2.0 percent to 7,390 compared to 7,244 in the prior year. Total student enrollment increased 7.2 percent to 29,083 students compared to 27,133 during the same period last year.

DeVry Brasil's Ruy Barbosa and Faculdade Boa Viagem each received top five rankings by the Ministry of Education among institutions located in the cities of Salvador and Recife.

#### Balance Sheet/Cash Flow

For the first nine months of fiscal year 2013, DeVry generated \$282 million of operating cash flow. As of March 31, 2013, cash, marketable securities and investment balances totaled \$281 million and there were no outstanding borrowings.

#### Share Repurchase Plan

During the quarter, DeVry repurchased 347,280 shares of its common stock for approximately \$9.8 million, at an average cost of \$28.18 per share.

During the third quarter of fiscal year 2013, DeVry recorded a restructuring charge to consolidate a facility at Carrington Colleges as well as for the severance charges within DeVry University and DeVry Medical International. During the second quarter of fiscal year 2013, DeVry recorded a restructuring charge for the write-down of land, building and equipment related to its decision to relocate a facility in Wood Dale, IL, in order to consolidate administrative operations in the Chicagoland area. DeVry also recorded restructuring charges to consolidate facilities at Carrington College and DeVry University. During the second quarter of fiscal year 2012, DeVry recorded impairment charges related to its Carrington Colleges reporting unit. DeVry also recorded a gain from the sale of Becker's Stalla CFA review operations. The following table illustrates the effects of these restructuring and impairment charges and gain on sale of assets on DeVry's results. Management believes that the non-GAAP disclosure of net income and earnings per share provides investors with useful supplemental information regarding the underlying business trends and performance of DeVry's ongoing operations and is useful for period-over period comparisons of such operations given the discrete nature of the restructuring and impairment charges and gain on the sale of assets. DeVry uses these supplemental financial measures internally in its management and budgeting processes. However, the non-GAAP financial measures should be viewed in addition to, and not as a substitute for, DeVry's reported results prepared in accordance with GAAP. 



Clubs and activities reflect students' interests and may change periodically. Questions concerning student activities can be addressed to the Student Services Office.



# Student Services

## Career Services

Professionals across the DeVry system work diligently to help graduates attain positions in their career fields. Although DeVry cannot guarantee employment, the school's career services staff works diligently with graduates to guide and motivate them through the career search process. Staff members work with students on career planning, job interviewing and resumé preparation.

In addition, DeVry's career services professionals maintain ongoing contact with local and national employers to keep abreast of employment needs and opportunities throughout the country, and share this information with students and graduates.

As graduation approaches, students are advised of career opportunities so employment interviews with various companies can be scheduled. In many cases, company representatives conduct interviews at DeVry. To maximize employment opportunities, students/graduates are highly encouraged to consider positions in other geographic markets where career-related opportunities may be concentrated.

Students are encouraged to start their career searches well in advance of graduation. Those who postpone an active career search should note that the level of career services assistance they receive might be less comprehensive. Students who impose employment restrictions, such as opting not to relocate, may similarly restrict their employment options.

After graduation, those not yet employed are expected to continue an active employment search while continuing to receive career assistance from DeVry.

To comply with reporting requirements, DeVry reserves the right to contact a graduate's employer using various methods to verify information regarding the graduate's employment. In some instances, DeVry may disclose personal information to the employer for the sole purpose of employment verification; at no time will such information be published.

The level of career services offered to international students/graduates varies and depends on employment opportunities permitted by the North American Free Trade Agreement and/or on students'/graduates' visas.

DeVry's career services are geared to the needs of students and prospective employers. Students' career efforts are supported by:

### Employer Database

DeVry maintains an interactive employer database that contains information on thousands of North American companies. This database is available to students and alumni via the Internet and provides real-time access to current job leads, details on career events and other career-related information. Career Services may also leverage strategic partnerships for additional career-related resources.

### Career Fairs

Career fairs are held periodically to enable students to meet and talk with recruiters from various industries.

These and other services help support one of the strongest career services efforts in higher education.

## Student Awards

### Leadership Award

### Innovation and Impact Award

This award is bestowed upon one student from each of the University's five Colleges who best demonstrates outstanding academic achievement in his or her program of study. Undergraduate students enrolled on campus or online may be eligible to receive this award.

This award recognizes one undergraduate student from each of the University's five Colleges who has exhibited perseverance and achieved outstanding success under challenging circumstances. Undergraduate students enrolled on campus or online may be eligible to receive this award.

In today's rapidly changing business world, continuing education is a lifelong process. To this end, alumni who hold a DeVry University bachelor's and/or master's degree may take advantage of the opportunity to enroll as nonmatriculating students in as many as 24 semester-credit hours of undergraduate coursework on a space-available basis for a reduced tuition rate. Students must submit a Tuition Reduction form prior to Sunday of week four of the session in order for the alumni tuition rate to be applied to the current session. If the form is submitted after this deadline, the alumni tuition rate becomes effective the following session. This benefit does not apply to graduate coursework. Details are available from the registrar or chief location administrator.

## Housing

DeVry helps students secure living arrangements; however, formal housing assistance is not provided to online students or to those attending DeVry's New York locations. Three housing options may be available.

### Private Apartments

The Student Housing Office maintains a list of available apartments in the local area. A security deposit equal to the first month's rent is generally required in advance to reserve these apartments. A rental or credit history may also be required. Leasing terms are established between apartment complexes/owners and students.

### Student Plan Housing

Student plan housing provides convenient, affordable housing. Most DeVry locations offer this option by which apartments are secured and arranged for through DeVry. Students using this option submit a reservation fee and form to the Student Housing Office to secure a furnished, shared apartment, and all subsequent housing fees are paid to DeVry.

### Private Rooms

The Student Housing Office maintains a list of available private rooms in private residences. Accommodations vary. Leasing terms are established between property owners and students.

Approximate housing costs and other information are available in the housing information packet or from the Student Housing Office. Students who need help locating housing or who have problems related to living arrangements should contact the office.

DeVry is committed to a policy of nondiscrimination in housing, and all housing to which students are referred complies with this policy.

### Part-Time-Employment Assistance

Most DeVry students work part time to help meet living expenses, and the Student Services Office assists currently enrolled students in finding part-time jobs. New students become eligible for this assistance on the first day of classes; however, assistance is not available to online students.

In addition, DeVry may help upper-term students find career-related part-time jobs through the cooperative education (co-op) program. Co-op positions are limited in number and are generally awarded to students with above average academic performance.

Because employment opportunities depend on local business conditions, DeVry cannot guarantee jobs. However, DeVry works aggressively to secure part-time-job leads and to refer students to these leads. Early-term students should not expect part-time jobs to be in curriculum-related areas. Work schedules beyond 25 hours per week are not recommended.

### Bookstore

Textbooks, software and required supplies, such as parts and kits for lab projects, are available in the school bookstore. Online students' purchases must be made through the online bookstore. Supplementary books and supplies may also be available.

### Student Records

All materials submitted in support of students' applications, including transcripts from other institutions, letters of reference and related documents, become the property of DeVry University. During a student's enrollment, DeVry maintains records that include admission and attendance information, academic

transcripts and other relevant data. Student academic records are maintained in accordance with DeVry's academic document retention schedule after the student is no longer enrolled. (Student academic records are maintained five years in New Jersey, and three years for veterans affairs records, after the student is no longer enrolled.) Students who wish to review their files must submit a written request to the registrar. Permanent student records include admission information and academic transcripts.

Except as required by law, no information regarding attendance, grades or any other aspect of students' academic standing will be released to any third party without written student consent.

### Official Transcripts

Official transcripts are available to students and graduates at no charge. Students must submit written transcript requests to the Registrar's Office. Official transcripts are not issued until all financial obligations to any DeVry institution are fulfilled.

### Army ROTC – Columbus, Ohio

Qualified students interested in obtaining an Officer's Commission in the U.S. Army, Ohio National Guard or Army Reserve may enroll in Army ROTC classes through a contracted agreement between Capital University and the U.S. Army.

Training is composed of classroom activities and outdoor instruction. Freshman and sophomore students may enroll in the four-year program consisting of the two-year general military course and the two-year Professional Officer course. There is no military obligation for students in the first two years of the program.

Students with a minimum 2.50 cumulative grade point average may apply for Army ROTC scholarships. Scholarship applications are normally made during the fall semester and must be completed by January 30.

Information on specific Army ROTC courses is available from the registrar. Additional information is available from the program chairperson for military science at 614.236.7114.

### Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges

DeVry University is a member of the Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges (SOC) Consortium and the SOC Degree Network System.

SOC Consortium colleges and universities are committed to expanding and improving voluntary post-secondary educational opportunities for servicemembers worldwide. SOC Consortium members subscribe to principles and criteria to ensure quality academic programs are available to active-duty-military students and their family members, as well as to veterans.

DeVry University is also a member of the SOC Degree Network System, a subgroup of SOC Consortium member institutions selected by the military services to deliver specific associate and bachelor's degree programs to servicemembers and their families. As a member of the DNS, the University adheres to academic policies intended to support military students in their academic endeavors toward degree completion.

DeVry University is approved for membership in the SOC DNS for the:

# Mission, Accreditation & Approvals

## GENERAL NOTES

The pages that follow describe each DeVry University program, including program objectives, degree awarded, program length, and outlines that display program options and courses required for graduation. DeVry reserves the right to change graduation requirements and to revise, add or delete courses.

Applicants and students should consult DeVry's admissions staff, or their student success professional or academic advisor, when reviewing information regarding DeVry locations, programs and courses such as:

### Enrolled Location

Students must select a primary location to attend. This location, known as the enrolled location, is reflected in enrollment materials and in DeVry's student information system. Students may take some classes online and at other DeVry locations. However, programs and specializations are limited to those offered by students' enrolled location. At some locations, restrictions may be placed on coursework taken online.

### Programs

When choosing programs and selecting courses and areas of specialization, students should be aware that availability of programs, specializations (including concentrations, majors, technical specialties and tracks) and courses varies by location. Some courses, including those required for some specializations, may be available online only. However, in some programs, some courses may not be taken online.

Program outlines show the minimum credit hours required for graduation. In some programs, there may be a slight difference between minimum credit hours required for graduation and total credit hours required if all courses are taken at DeVry. Credit hour differences may benefit students with qualifying transfer credit. Students should contact their student success professional or academic advisor for more information.



### Specializations

# Accounting Program, Associate Degree

DeVry's associate degree program in Accounting equips students with the knowledge, skills and abilities needed to function as entry-level accounting professionals in public accounting, industry, nonprofit organizations and government. # Business Administration Program

**General Business Option Plan I**

Selected coursework must total at least 27 semester-credit hours, and students' total programs must include at least 42 semester-credit hours of upper-division coursework (DeVry courses numbered 300–499). A solid base in business fundamentals and general education, combined with in-depth skills in the chosen area of interest, qualifies graduates to contribute to organizational success in a wide variety of areas.

**Business Administration Program – General Business Option Plan II<sup>10</sup>**

Qualified graduates of approved international three-year business-related programs may select this option, which provides a direct path to earning a recognized bachelor's degree. International credentials considered for approval – from China, India, Singapore and the United Kingdom, among others – include higher national diplomas, three-year bachelor's degrees and the equivalent.

Plan II also paves the way for graduate study. In lieu of choosing a major/concentration leading to specialized knowledge and skills, students choose to become business generalists, familiar with many aspects of international business and qualified for entry-level opportunities in business areas.

Eligible students receive general credit of 83 semester-credit hours for their qualifying credential and must meet the following additional course requirements for graduation.

They may include selected DeVry coursework, qualifying coursework from a prior college experience or a combination of both.

# Technical Management Program

To meet the needs of adult students, DeVry developed its bachelor's-degree-completion program in Technical Management. The curriculum helps students with qualifying prior college experience add an important credential – a bachelor's degree – to their resumé. The program also offers technical specialties to facilitate students' advancement to supervisory or management positions in their chosen field of specialization. Specialties are shown in the following program outline, as is a general technical option, which students may take in lieu of a specific technical specialty.

The criminal justice specialty is designed for students with at least one year of professional experience in law enforcement, criminal justice or a closely related field.

To enroll in any health information management specialty courses, students must hold a DeVry-recognized associate degree in health information technology or an active RHIT certification.

Students who have not chosen an area of specialization may begin the program in "Undeclared" status; however, they must select a technical specialty by the time they have earned 30 semester-credit hours toward their degree.

## Program Objectives

The program is designed to produce graduates who are able to:

- Use applied research and problem-solving skills, including presenting recommendations through comprehensive reports, communicating effectively both orally and in writing, and working effectively in leadership and support roles within a team environment.
- Demonstrate supervisory and management skills needed to effectively lead and support others within a specialty and across business functions.
- Apply critical thinking skills to identify and evaluate existing processes, identify needs, and structure business approaches by using established methodologies and standards.

## Individual Plans of Study

Degree requirements are specified in an individual plan of study developed with each student through academic advising. At least 42 semester-credit hours must be earned in upper-division coursework (DeVry courses numbered 300–499).
