**Return Objectives and Risk Parameters** – The Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to maintain over time the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Endowment assets include those assets of donor-restricted funds that the Foundation must hold in perpetuity or for a donor-specified period(s) as well as board-designated funds. Under the Foundation's policies, endowment assets are invested in a manner that emphasizes total return. Specifically, the primary objective is to emphasize long-term growth of principal while avoiding excessive risk, to achieve a balanced return of current income and modest growth of principal, and to achieve a rate of return equal to or higher than the Endowment & Foundation Index or other benchmarks as determined by the Board of Directors.

**D. Endowment (Continued)**

**Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives** – To satisfy its long-term rate-of-return objectives, the Foundation relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends). The Foundation targets a diversified asset allocation that places a greater emphasis on equity-based investments to achieve its long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints. The Foundation has outsourced its Investment Office to a Pennsylvania-based firm serving as Chief Investment Officer, to manage the Foundation's endowment assets under the guidance of the Foundation's Investment Policy and in consultation with the Investment Committee of the Board of Directors. The endowment assets of the Foundation are invested in a broad range of equities and debt securities, thereby limiting the market risk exposure in any single investment manager or individual investment.

**Spending Policy and How the Investment Objectives Relate to Spending Policy** – The Foundation has a policy of appropriating for distribution each year up to 5% of a three year rolling average of the fund's value. Likewise, it is the policy of the Foundation that, annually, up to 1.5% of a three year rolling average of the fund's value be designated for unrestricted use by the Foundation in furtherance of its singular mission to provide support for the advancement of the University. The policies are monitored by the Executive Committee of the Foundation's Board of Directors and may be amended in accordance with market conditions. Earnings above the annually designated portions are reinvested in the corpus to insure long-term growth and stability.

**Temporarily Restricted Net Assets** – Temporarily restricted net assets, net of amounts held for others, is available for scholarships and other program support.

**Permanently Restricted Net Assets** – Permanently restricted net assets consist of restricted endowments requiring principal to be invested in perpetuity. The income is available for scholarships, chairs and other University programs.

**H. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

**Arlington Golf Course and Facilities** – The Foundation has leased for a nominal amount the Arlington Golf Course and facilities (a golf course built and owned by the Foundation on Foundation land) to the Arlington Association, Inc. (“Arlington”) for its use for a term of one year with automatic renewal for each successive year. The lease can be terminated by either party with notice. As consideration for this lease, various departments of the University are permitted to use the golf course and related facilities for instructional purposes. Arlington bears all expenses for operation and maintenance of the golf course facility and, in return, receives all fees related to its operation. Arlington owes the Foundation \$572,925 and \$297,921 at June 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively, for unpaid lease payments. During fiscal year 2011, the Foundation extended a \$100,000 line of credit to Arlington to be used for ongoing capital improvements to buildings and property owned by the Foundation. This line of credit was increased to \$270,000 during 2012. Based upon a review of the financial condition of Arlington and its operating activity, an allowance of \$433,188 has been established as of June 30, 2012 as an estimate of the ultimate collectability of these receivables.

**Eastern Kentucky University** – The University provides various administrative services to the Foundation. As a result of these related-party services and other transactions, the Foundation has recorded a payable to the University of \$928,421 and \$164,822 as of June 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively.

The University disbursed \$376,753 and \$671,006 on behalf of the Foundation for employee salaries and benefits during the years ended June 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively. The University disbursed \$366,667 and \$464,718 on behalf of the Foundation for scholarships during the years ended June 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively. These disbursements are not reimbursed by the Foundation.

**I. BONDS PAYABLE**

The Foundation issued Variable Rate Demand Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2008, in the amount of \$1,770,000 through Fifth Third Bank to help finance the Arlington renovation project (see Note 8). The bonds mature in 2017 and have a variable interest rate that is based on the USD – SIFMA Municipal Swap Index. To protect the Foundation against a potential interest rate increase, the Foundation entered into an interest rate swap agreement, thereby locking into a fixed interest rate of 3.4% for the duration of the loan term. At June 30, 2012 and 2011, the interest rate swap had a total notional amount of \$1,320,000 and \$1,475,000, respectively. The fair value of the swap agreement reflects an obligation of the Foundation of \$109,015 and \$103,142 at June 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively. This change in value is recognized as a decrease in net assets and is included in net unrealized gains (losses) on the statement of activities. In addition to the unrealized loss noted above, the net settlements from the interest rate swap agreements are included within interest expense which is included in payments and support for the University. For the years ended June 30, 2012 and 2011, the net settlements resulted in an increase to interest expense in the amounts of \$43,887 and \$46,990, respectively. The swap agreement expires in 2017.

**K. ANNUITIES AND TRUSTS PAYABLE**

The Foundation has been the recipient of several gift annuities which require future payments to the donor or their named beneficiaries. The assets received from the donor are recorded at fair value. The Foundation has recorded a liability at June 30, 2012 and 2011 of \$388,754 and \$397,236, respectively, which represents the present value of the future annuity obligations which was determined by using discount rates ranging from 5.5% to 8.4%.


Eastern Kentucky University treats all online out of state students the same as traditional students who are on campus. The only difference between an online degree and a traditional degree is that the course work is completed online. Upon graduation, online students will hold a degree from Eastern Kentucky University, and will have all the rights and privileges of traditional EKU alumni.

Most EKU Online courses are offered in two 8-week terms in the fall and spring semesters and two 6-week terms in the summer. This accelerated schedule allows online students to focus on two classes per term and still carry a full-time load over the course of the semester.

EKU uses The Blackboard Learning System, which provides a framework for instructors to organize course material and interact with students through discussion boards, chat rooms and online assignments. Online students will log in to this system to access their courses. Some professors also produce mini-lectures on video and incorporate instructional videos in their course design. Others rely more on PowerPoint presentations, discussion boards and reading assignments. Most use a combination of strategies and techniques to ensure for a high level of interaction and instructor feedback.

Every course will be presented in Blackboard, which means online students will always work within a standardized course layout and navigation system. This will allow online students to devote their time to the coursework rather than the technology.

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


The curriculum at EKU is developed and approved through a rigorous internal process. This process begins with the department curriculum committee, comprised of faculty, which evaluates the appropriateness of the curricula for its degrees, certificates, and academic programs. When changes are recommended and approved at the department level, the curriculum changes are then sent to the appropriate college curriculum committee for review and approval (see sample curriculum change form). Depending on the nature of the proposed change, the curriculum changes might be reviewed by the Teacher Education Committee, the General Education Committee, and/or the Graduate Council before being reviewed and approved by the Council on Academic Affairs (CAA) and the Faculty Senate. All degree programs are reviewed and approved by EKU's Board of Regents. New or substantially modified programs are also reviewed and approved through the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE). This approval process involves two stages and considers the need of the program in the context of the mission of the University (see screen shot below) among other criteria, such a budget and assessment plans.













Percentage of Students Who Began Their Studies in Fall 2010 and Returned in Fall 2011




Percentage of Full-time, First-Time Students Who Graduated or Transferred Out Within 150% of "Normal Time" to Completion for Their Program



**GRADUATION RATES FOR STUDENTS PURSUING BACHELOR'S DEGREES**




Percentage of Full-time, First-time Students Who Graduated in the Specified Amount of Time












Percentage of Full-time, First-Time Students Who Graduated or Transferred Out Within 150% of "Normal Time" to Completion for Their Program












